Winter Raw or Spring Thaw! C'mon Phil!

If you were here last Sunday, you might recall a portion of my sermon included Punxsutawney Phil, the official expert on the advent of Spring. With 130 predictions in his little groundhog paws, he has predicted only 13.85% of the time for an early spring. However, he has been correct 39% of the time in his overall predictions. And here is a photo of Phil today, praying to God to send him the prediction he really wants to make for an early Spring when dawn breaks tomorrow.



With the dire news that Spring may be late, and more snow on the

way, we still have much to be thankful for in this community as we prepare for the coming of Spring and Easter. First, we made it through 2017 without taking additional funds from the Endowment; second the needed repairs in the Parish Hall are complete — and it is beautiful. Third, we have increased our Back Pack Blessing program to 78 backpacks a week! Christ Church and St. Barnabas' Chapel each has several new or returning people attending on Sundays who are taking an active part in the life of the church.

For me, I am thankful that God has blessed us with the good news that has been shared concerning our life together. I am personally thankful for all the many times people have generously donated their time to making me feel welcome; helping me move - twice, the cards and letters of care and encouragement, and for the privilege of being your priest and preacher. Who else is going to listen to me preach about Jesus' authority vs. Punxsutawney Phil's? Who else will present me with keys tied to a brick so I can't lose them? (Like that's really going to make a difference? Keep praying.) Who else will spend an entire day framing a "Celebration of New Ministry" bulletin complete with a picture?

As we celebrate the Epiphany Season of the Light of the World among us, let us look around us and notice all we have to be grateful for each day. Most especially that Jesus is in all of this and that even if winter sticks around a little longer, we still have much to celebrate and share with each other and with our neighbors. Jesus, unlike Phil, is 100% accurate in all he predicted. As we look forward to Spring and ultimately, Easter, let us seek the light of Christ in all we do. Amen.
